  - Vulnerable to staff illnesses/holidays
  - Where is my stuff?
- Centralized model once new HQ opened
  - One standard
  - One point of contact
  - Redundancy in the staff
  - One storage location\*

## What We Do - Generally

Guided by General Orders, statutes and industry best practices we:

- Receive, process, store, manage, and dispose of all property/evidence
- Oversee the inventory of general evidence and property
- Oversee the inventory of firearms, drugs, and cash
- Ensure that all evidence/property is properly packaged
- Forward certain evidence to other agencies (Health Canada, RCMP)
- Conduct regular stocktaking and quality assurance checks
- Liaise with other Evidence Units
- Return property to rightful owners
- Follow the standards of the International Association for Property and Evidence.




## What We Do - Day to Day

- Gather seized property and evidence from the various Divisions/Districts
- Ensure packaging materials are available at each Division/District
- Provide evidence to Officers attending court
- Return property to owners
- Dispose of property by other means (garbage, biohazard, handover to other agencies, auction, etc.)
- Liaise with various officers and units within the service
- The EMU does <u>not</u> handle cloud-based digital evidence



#### The Numbers

- Currently holding 44,347 tagged items
  - 1003 firearms tagged
  - 8490 drugs tagged
  - 2398 securities tagged
- Average of 1500 items in each month
- Average of 1464 items out each month
- Goal of the EMU:
  - 1 item in, 1 item out
  - Goal achieved in 2022 and 2023
- Homicide and Sex Assault cases tend to stay for longer periods




# The International Association for Property and Evidence (IAPE)

- Sets the industry standards utilized by Services throughout North America and the world



#### Accreditation

- The NRPS is Canada's only accredited agency
- One of 12 accredited agencies in the world
- International Criminal Court in the Hague, Netherlands is accredited
- In 2024 we will renew our accredited status by:
  - Renewing General Orders
  - Renewing standard operating procedures
  - Re-issuing our evidence packaging manual
  - Undergoing audit by the IAPE
    - 800-point questionnaire\*
    - 1 weeklong on-site visit
    - Follow up to "critical requirements" identified



## Accreditation (Why?)

- Accreditation displays a commitment to excellence
- Accreditation demonstrates commitment to the community
- Accreditation helps ensure the integrity of criminal justice process
